The Church Door

This month we conclude the season of Easter which last for 7 Sundays before heading into the long season of Pentecost. You may recall that the Day of Pentecost (from a Greek word meaning fiftieth) is always seven weeks after Easter Sunday; that is to say, 50 days after Easter (inclusive of Easter Day). The Day of Pentecost is often thought of as the birthday of the Church.

During the season of Easter the Church is sort of prepared to carry out the mission Christ has given to it. As we finish out the Easter season, I thought it might be interesting to look at the Gospel acclamation for each Sunday which will point us to the focus for that Sunday.

On May 3 Jesus refers to himself as the Good Shepherd who lays down his life for his sheep. Alleluia. Jesus says, I am the good shepherd. I know my own and my own know me. Alleluia. (John 10:14) The Psalm refrain is The Lord is my shepherd, I shall not want. (Psalm 23:1).

For May 10 Jesus says he is the vine and we are the branches. We draw nourishment from him and bear fruit. Alleluia. I am the vine, you are the branches. Those who abide in me and I in them bear much fruit. Alleluia. (John 15:5). The Psalm refrain is All the ends of the earth shall remember and turn to the Lord; and all the families of the nations shall worship before him. (Psalm 22:27)

On May 17 Jesus gives the command to love one another as he has loved us. Alleluia. Those who love me will keep my word, and my Father will love them, and we will come to them and make our home with them. Alleluia. (John 14:23). The Psalm refrain is Make a joyful noise to the Lord, all the earth; break forth into joyous song and sing praises. (Psalm 98:4).

May 24 sees Jesus as he prepares to leave the world and prays that the Father will protect those whom he leaves behind. Alleluia. I will not leave you orphaned, | says the Lord. I am coming to you. Alleluia. (John 14:18) The Psalm refrain: for the Lord watches over the way of the righteous, but the way of the wicked will perish. (Psalm 1:6)

May 31 is the Sunday of Pentecost. *Alleluia. Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of* your faithful, and kindle in us the fire of your love. Alleluia. The Psalm refrain: When you send forth your spirit, they are created; and you renew the face of the ground. (Psalm 104:30). With this Sunday we begin the season of Pentecost, the longest of the church seasons. There are 24 Sundays after Pentecost this year before we reach Christ the King Sunday, the last Sunday of the year.

So Christ is our leader, our Shepherd who lays down his life for us. He is the vine which nourishes us so that we can bear fruit. He gives us the command to love one another so that we can stick together and also prays for our protection as we are in the world. Finally he sends his Holy Spirit on the Day of Pentecost. This will be our focus as we come together to worship on the Sundays in May. I pray that the Spirit makes each of us healthy and willing to come together to worship the one who gave his life for ours. God's blessings to all, **Pastor Dennis**

SECRETARY'S REPORT: Secretary's report created by Cindy Borreson for February 16, 2009 was presented in printed form. Treasurer's report was for January, not December as stated. Jeff Parkison is the spelling, not Parkinson. Thank you to Cindy for doing this in Donna's absence.

TREASURER'S REPORT: The Treasurer's report for February was presented in printed form.

Pastor's Report: A written report was submitted.

Committee Reports

Property: Worked on speakers & lights. Arranged for work on the toilets and the fountains. The cost so far is \$315 against a quote of \$420. Jeff Parkison reported that the porcelain fountains cost more than the stainless steel with cooling units. Jeff P. quoted \$1200 to replace both with stainless steel (without hooking up the electrical to the cooling unit). Council wants to continue looking at other options. Tom called Nichols Paper again about the stripping of the nave, still no call back. Tom went to the Builder's Show to investigate on-demand water heaters, but no such vendors were there. Property needs to look striping the parking lot and perhaps look at paving the extra lot. Need to order receivers for the Loop system.

Evangelism/Social Ministry:

We're collecting soup for Rescue Mission, Feinstein is going to match this. Free Methodist is beginning a food pantry. We'll look into helping them.

Finance: Did not meet. Letter to the congregation did not get written yet, but still needs to be done. Insurance and Board of Pensions will wipe out checking account.

Parish Education: Did not meet. Will set up a date to meet and plan an Easter program. Cindy will help children with the cooking for Easter Breakfast.

Stewardship: Dave presented Stories to Tell & Gifts to Share

stewardship materials. He'd like to start this program soon. Would like a Celebration Sunday (Commitment Sunday). He passed out bookmarks with discussion points to talk over at home. These will be passed out to the congregation.

Worship & Music: Will be meeting on Mar. 24 and planning Easter. Remember the favorite hymn list. Do we want to continue receiving the Lutheran Social Service newsletter "His Hand"? Council agreed that we would no longer receive it (we do nothing, and that will stop it).

Executive Committee/ Mutual
Ministry: Need to meet again.
Jeff will arrange a date to meet.

Special Committees

Dorcas Circle/Eve Circle: Oven needs repair. Temperature isn't right. May need a new thermostat. Mother/child banquet is coming up. They'll ask the men to cook. Jeff will help. Possible date is May 4th. Pastor will find out the date.

Men's Club: Did not meet. Need to decide on time and place and let Cindy know.

Thrivent Habitat: Chili Cook-off at First Lutheran was a success. They may have made more than last year.

Stony Lake Conference: Golf outing is May 30 with rain date June 6. The forms will be posted on the bulletin board. Early registration cost is \$55 by May 1, otherwise \$60.

2 T skim milk


2 Toil


